Making Progress...

Self Registration

After the half term holiday, the children will be encouraged to find their own names every morning before starting to play. Please support your child to develop this routine by taking them to their family group area and helping them to find their name.



How can I support my child at home?

Encourage your child to understand that print has meaning by looking at print in the environment; for example supermarket names on carrier bags, price tags and menus.

Enjoy reading all sorts of books together fiction, non-fiction, rhymes, whatever your child chooses. Talk about the pictures and encourage your child to retell stories and interesting facts using the illustrations.

Don't forget to change library books as often as you wish from the box in the cloak room.

Independence

We are encouraging the children to be confident and independent at managing their own needs. Please encourage your child to have a go at putting on their own coat, shoes, wellies ... The half term holiday is a good time to practice.

What have the children been learning?

The children have been learning all about themselves this half term including looking at their faces and bodies, talking about feelings, learning about our families and who we love and this week we have been learning about our senses.

We have been doing lots of sensory learning including ice play, making our own different scented play doughs, exploring different coloured spaghetti and much more! All to encourage the children to use their communication and describing skills.

We have also been looking at seasonal changes and talking about what happens in Autumn. The children have enjoyed going over to our Forest School and looking for signs of Autumn.
