How can I support my child at home?

We are looking at the story of each number to 5. This involves recognising groups of objects and the patterns they make without having to count each time.

Practise looking at collections of objects, dots on a dice or dominoes and recognise the amount without counting. How many times can you get it right?

Reminders

- 1) Remember to read at least 3 times per week for a certificate this will help your child become more confident at school and
- 2) Please ensure that your child's belongings are all labelled with their name.
- 3) Water bottles need to be in school every Monday so children can have a drink during the day.
- 4) Long hair must be tied back please.

Reception have had a busy half term exploring the topic of Magic. We have used our imagination to think of potion ingredients and make up spells. We were fascinated by an experiment that mixed vinegar and bicarbonate of soda!

We are learning to blend the sounds in three letter words in order to read them.
