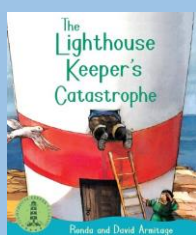

### **Stay safe , Speak out visitor**

This week Year 1 enjoyed a visit from Anna from the NSPCC who came to talk about keeping themselves safe.

The key messages were that-

All children have the right to:

Speak out and be heard

Be safe

Get help when they need it

She talked about the children feeling confident to talk to a trusted adult and the children shared who these were at school and at home.

Anna also talked about appropriate social media use.

She talked to the children about how important it is to only be friends on line with people they know in real life.

## How to help at home.

We are working on using money to add and to find change. Please help your child by using the following activities.

- 1) Recognising coins and their values. 5p is the same as five 1ps etc
- 2) Using the shops in your homework book - choose 2 items to add together and find the total. What coins would you use to pay? What if you bought 3 items? What would the total be then?
- 3) Finding change - If you had 50p or £1 what could you buy? How much change will you get? Use the shop keeper method to count on from your total to find your change.
