Uniform Policy

We are continuing to reinforce the message of e-safety and for children to report anything they are concerned about to a trusted adult. Also a reminder to ensure that children are playing, watching and downloading age appropriate material on their home devices.

NSPCC visit

This week Year 3 enjoyed a visit from Anna from the NSPCC who came to talk about keeping ourselves safe.

The key messages were that All children have the right to:
Speak out and be heard
Be safe

Get help when they need it
She talked about the children feeling confident to talk to a trusted adult and the children shared who these were at school and at home.

Anna also talked about appropriate game use and reminded the children that Fortnite: Battle Royale is not an appropriate game for them to be playing- the PEGI rating for it is 12. She talked to the children about how important it is to only be friends on line with people they know in real life.
